New Scholarships

Cabrillo Civic Clubs of California-\$400 scholarships to students of Portuguese descent with a min. 3.5 GPA and record of extra-curricular participation. Deadline March 15.

Redwood Empire Chinese Association Scholarship-A \$500 scholarship to a graduating senior who is of Asian descent or whose family are members of the Redwood Empire Chinese Association. Good academic and community service records are required. Due March 31.

Asian Scholarship Fund-\$1,000-\$2,500 awards to outstanding students with at least one parent of Asian ancestry. Students must have strong academic and leadership record, history of volunteer work or working for pay due to financial need. Due March 31.

James E. Roberts 2005 Engineering Scholarship-Two \$1,000 scholarships to graduating seniors who are seeking career related to transportation and will be enrolling in civil engineering curriculum at a California Community College, CSU or UC. Due March 24

Italian American Club of Sonoma County-\$500 scholarships to graduating seniors. Goals, academic standing and test scores will be considered. Sonoma County graduates will be considered regardless of race, creed or national origin. Due March 1

Oprah's National High School Essay Contest: up to \$100,000 in prizes. Submit a 1000 word essay on "Why is Elie Wiesel's book Night relevant today?" California Association of Collector's: 1 \$2,500, 1 \$2,000 and 1 \$1,500 awards to students who write a winning essay on "The Proper Use of Credit in the 21st Century." Application available at www.cacesf.org. Must be received by March 1.

Redwood Empire ASHRAE Year 2005 Scholarship-At least two \$1,000 scholarships to graduates who have desire to pursue careers in field of environmental or mechanical engineering. Applicants must have history of community service and min. 3.0 GPA. Due May 2.

USTA Tennis Education Foundation: numerous awards to students who have participated in United States Tennis Association (USTA) and other organized youth tennis programs. Applicants must demonstrate financial need. Must be postmarked by Feb. 3.

FFA Scholarship Book-Numerous scholarships are available to FFA members. Check catalog in the Career Center for details. Applications for all scholarships in book are due Feb. 15.

USAFunds Access to Education: numerous \$1,500 renewable awards to students who have an annual adjusted gross income of \$35,000 or less and planning to attend a 2 or 4 year college. 50% of the scholarships will go to applicants of an ethnic minority group (Alaskan Native, American Indian, Black/African American, Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islander, Asian or Hispanic or Latino) or have a documented physical disability. Apply on-line at www.usafunds.org by March 1.

SAMMY, Scholar Athlete Milk Mustache of the Year Award-National competition for 25 outstanding scholar/athletes who will receive \$7,500 awards. Applications available on line at www.whymilk.com. Due March 3.

S.F. Cherry Blossom Community Service Scholarship-Graduating senior of Japanese descent, with at least 2.5 GPA and outstanding community service record can apply for \$2,000 scholarship. Due March 23.

Maggie Stotts Scholarship Fund-WESCO Scholarship-Scholarships to graduating seniors who have participated as players on WESCO teams. Scholastic achievement and financial need will be considered. Recipients must carry 9+ units in Fall '05. Due March 31

Gray Foundation Scholarship-"to provide financial support to high school students who would, otherwise, be unable to reach their full potential without financial assistance" \$1,000 renewable scholarship requires min. 2.5 GPA. Due March 31.

Society of Women Engineers Scholarship-Golden Gate Section-Scholarships open to female, graduating senior entering a bachelors degree program in engineering, computer science, physical science or mathematics. Due April 8.

Commitment to Agriculture Scholarship-Open to graduating senior whose family is actively engaged in production agriculture and who will enter two or four-year college university, vocational or technical school in the Fall. Must be planning to pursue career in the field of agriculture. Applications online at www.monsanto.com. Due Feb. 15.

Educational Communications Scholarship Foundation-Numerous scholarships of from \$1,000-\$6,000 to graduating seniors. SAT/ACT scores, GPA, activities and financial need will be considered. *\$3.50 processing fee required-consider carefully. Due February 24.

Italian Catholic Federation-\$400 scholarships to graduates enrolling in two or four year college programs and are Catholic and of Italian descent or whose parents or grandparents are members of ICF. 3.2 min. GPA required. Due March 15

Kaiser Permanente Asian Association Scholarship-(4) \$2000 scholarships to graduate who will be attending two or four year college, university, trade or tech. school, is of Asian descent and has min. 2.5 GPA. Due Feb. 24

Russian River Wine Road Scholarship-Two \$500 scholarships to graduates whose parents are employed by current winery or lodging members of the Russian River Wine Road. Due April 4.
