**DEADLINES:** You can e-mail your entry no later than **Wednesday May 14**. Please include your students' first and last names in the entry. All **changes to the entry must be made by Friday May 16** to avoid the registration fees.

**MONEY** matters: The cost is \$15.00 per student. Checks should be made payable to "AHS debate team."

**FOOD:** Students can purchase food throughout the day. Lunch will be sold for \$5.00 per person. Each school will receive two free lunch tickets to feed teachers or parents who are chaperoning students. **STUDENTS ARE NOT PERMITTED TO LEAVE CAMPUS DURING LUNCH.**

**DRESS:** Students should dress schnazzy—slacks and a tie for guys; skirt or slacks and a blouse for girls. Dress like you want to appear as a guest on *The Daily Show*, not *Jerry Springer*.

**JUDGES:** Analy's varsity debate team members will act as judges. If you have varsity kids who would like to judge—just let me know in your entry.

**AWARDS:** Awards will be given to the top seven speakers in each event! Every student will receive ballots and comment sheets at the end of the tournament.

## S.P.A.R. Spontaneous Argumentation

### **FORMAT**

Two students are selected. They speak from the front of the room. One student will debate the Affirmative, supporting the topic and the other student will debate the Negative, opposing the topic. The sides are assigned in a random manner. The students are given the topic and both look at it for one minute. The debate progresses using the following format:

Affirmative Opening .....	One Minute
Negative Opening .....	One Minute
Unstructured Argumentation.....	Three Minutes
Negative Closing.....	One Minute
Affirmative Closing.....	One Minute

In "Unstructured Argumentation" each student should be polite, but firm in asserting his/her right to speak, while allowing his/her opponent a chance to speak. Members of the audience may raise their hand to ask questions; the speakers have the option of accepting the questions.

### **SPEAKER DUTIES**

One minute speeches should give a sense of having a beginning, a middle and an end. There should be an introductory remark or two, a brief presentation of arguments supporting their assigned position, and some concluding remarks. All speeches other than the first affirmative should make some reference to what was said before. During speeches, the students do not address each other. They address the audience. During the unstructured argumentation, students may address each other, but they must face the audience.

### **TOPICS**

Topics will be drawn from three topic areas:

Quotations: ( e.g. Agree or disagree with Plato when he said "Poets are Liars.")

Values: ( e.g. In education, books are more important than technology.)

Current Events: ( e.g. The U.S. should boycott the summer Olympics.)

### **EVALUATION:**

Each student is judged individually; this is not as win-lose debate. The students will be evaluated and ranked on the following: analysis, examples, clash, and courtesy.

### Counselor's Corner

All of you are concerned about the transition from high school to the next step. It is an unknown time filled with much anticipation and anxiety. Be sure to see your counselor to talk through your questions and transitions. It's all normal!

Finally, graduation participation is based on successful completion of ALL make up work whether it's at SRJC, after school classes or Independent Study contracts. Additionally, your satisfactory attendance to required classes MUST be within the limits of our variable attendance – credit policy. These requirements WILL be verified before the graduation ceremony! Be fully aware of your status. See your counselor if you have questions!

### Analy Education Foundation 2007-2008 Year-End Report

## Math Department

### Tutoring

Free math tutoring can be arranged through the Tutoring Center. Have your student stop by the library to find out how they can get help. The Tutoring Center also offers free drop-in tutoring (no appointment necessary) for Algebra (all levels) Tuesdays and Thursdays after school and Geometry Wednesdays after school.

The math department has collected a list of students who will tutor for pay for nearly all math subjects. Have your student talk to his or her math teacher if you want to hire a student tutor. Santa Rosa JC has a list of tutors available for hire at <http://online.santarosa.edu/presentation/page/?23318>.

### Homework

The Analy math department has a common homework policy: A student needs to earn 66% or higher on homework or the highest overall grade they can earn in a math class is a D. Homework provides practice, and practice is a big part of strengthening math skills. In addition, we often cover material in homework that we don't end up putting on a test or quiz. This policy is designed to motivate students to get into the habit of doing their homework and ultimately to do better on tests, quizzes, and their entire course. In addition, we often assign problems for homework that are harder, more difficult, or more interesting than what ultimately shows up on tests and quizzes. Not doing the homework thus means missing out on a significant part of what we are covering in the class. If you have questions about the policy, contact your student's math teacher.

### Calling for unused equipment

- Calculators: If you have an unused scientific or graphing calculator laying around your house (perhaps in a room formerly inhabited by a current college student who used to attend Analy) we could put it to good use in the math department. Just drop any calculator that you no longer need by room 103 or have your current student give it to their math teacher. Thanks!
- Palm Pilots: A new grading application we have site licensed here at Analy allows teachers to walk around a class and enter scores into a Palm-based grading program that syncs with their regular desktop grading program, greatly streamlining homework processing. If you have an old Palm that is laying around gathering dust that you'd be willing to donate to get someone else up and running, please contact Walt Hays at 824.2362 or [whays@analy.org](mailto:whays@analy.org). The requirements are as follows: Palm OS 4.x or 5.x, 256+ colors, touch screen and stylus.
- Old laptops: If you have an unused or outdated laptop computer that you are willing to donate, please contact Casey Shea at [cshea@analy.org](mailto:cshea@analy.org) or 824.2300 x 2460. We are investigating their use as Linux thin clients in a math class context. Even laptops with broken or missing hard drives are welcome. If you know of a local business that is upgrading a set of computers (laptop or desktop) we'd also be interested in hearing about it.
